Over the course of the week, you'll take part in engaging classroom discussions, demonstrations, guest lecturers and produce a final project demonstrating your new data informed decision making skills to solve an existing agricultural challenge in front of a panel of industry professionals.

As part of your camp curriculum, you get to enjoy two afternoons exploring AgSmart 2023, an outdoor educational agriculture expo featuring live equipment and technology demonstrations, educational sessions and exhibits discussing emerging trends in the agriculture industry.


